After a dry summer the countryside was very barren apart from the vine's and trees. There are plenty of wine tasting opportunity here with a cost of about 8 Euro.



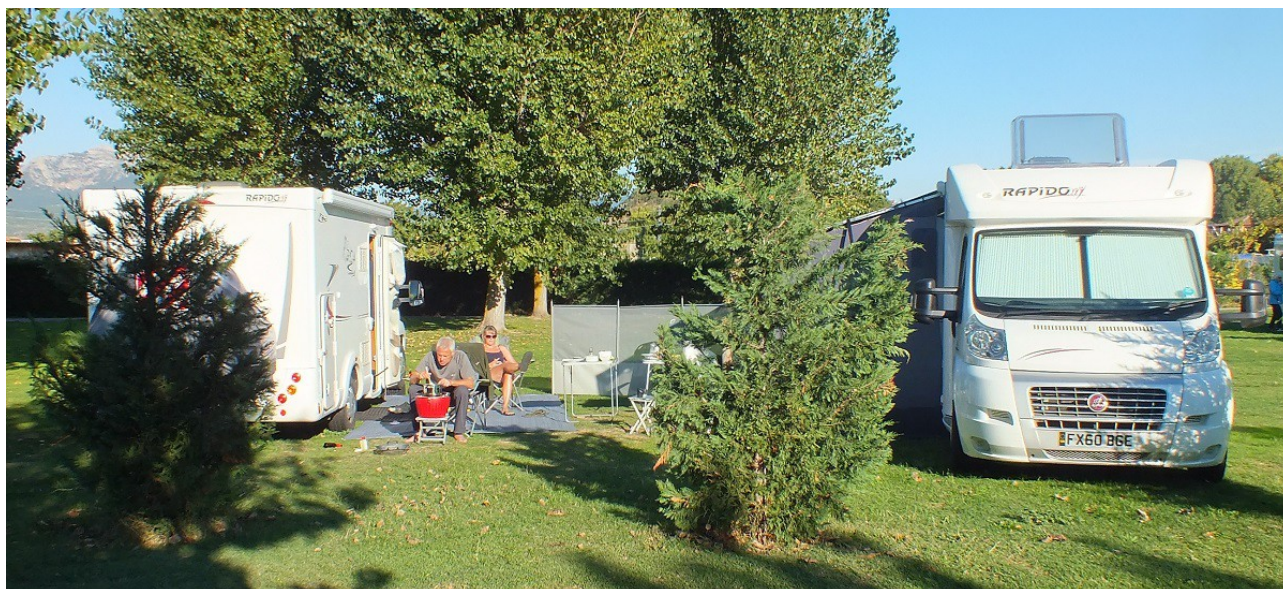

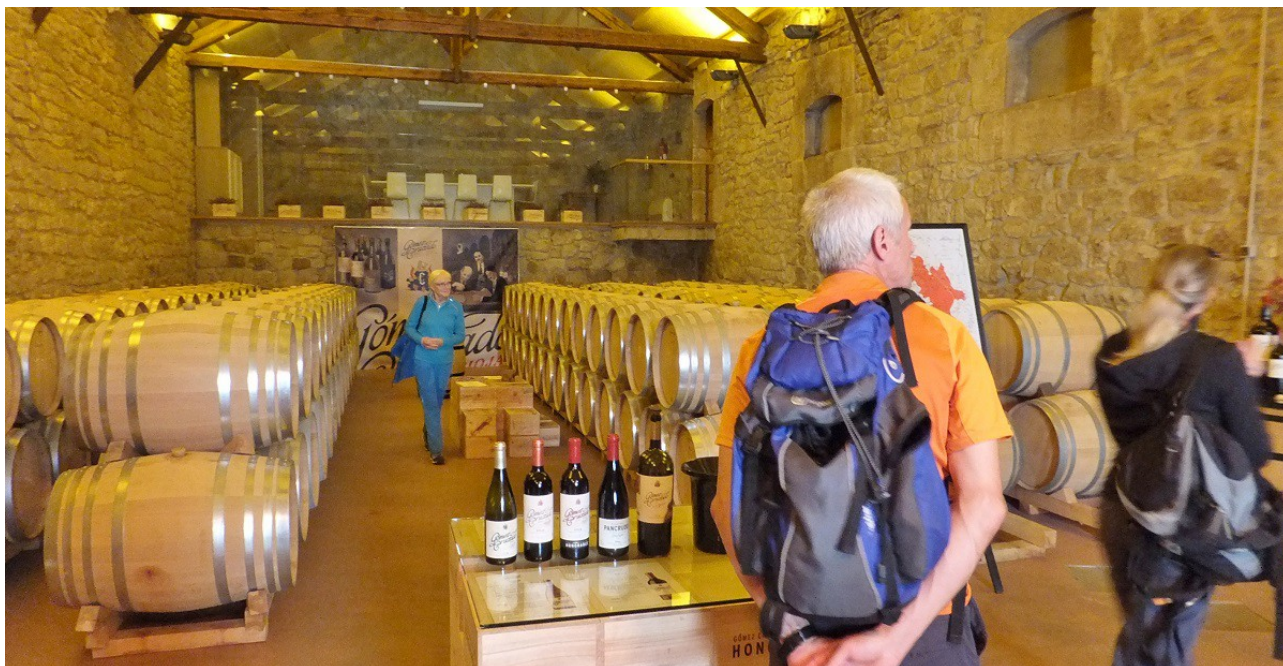


But other nights were great for a Barbi.
